Cristina: I will never forget all the people I have met here, and also, all the new things I have made with people that I've just met and has turned into my family, and not to say all of the experiences I've lived. It's an experience you will never forget.

6. Imagine that one of your friends wants to do Erasmus in Hungary. What would you tell him/her?

Albina: In the short period that I studied in Hungary with Erasmus, many students asked me questions about admission and whether it is worth enrolling at all. I always answered YES! You should try to see the education system in Europe and get to know this European quiet life. It is here that you will understand the meaning of your life as a whole. At least, in my case it was. In Debrecen, I realized that I would definitely try my best to return to Europe. And that means studying well and working hard to achieve your goals.

Cristina: First of all, being honest, to be patient with the people of the country, some of them are really stubborn and have no patience, but you should always have be patient.
